

Coddington Cove Rubble Fill Area

Fact Sheet Update (January 2002)

INTRODUCTION

A Study Area Screening Evaluation (SASE) was begun at the Coddington Cove Rubble Fill Area (study area 04) in 1992.

BACKGROUND

Study Area 04 is a small area (less than 8 acres) that was used between 1978 to 1982 as for general fill. Records researched for the initial assessment study indicated that the area was used for the disposal of rubble, concrete, asphalt, slate, wood, brush, and possibly small quantities of ash.

This area lies on the shoreward side of Coddington highway and the rail spur, south of the former shipyard area.



There is no chemical data available for the site, and there is currently no activity there. The area is fenced and unoccupied.

RECENT ACTIVITIES

Due to the low possibility for exposure posed by the unoccupied site, and due to the low likelihood of contamination at the site, this site is regarded as a low priority for the IR program. There have been no remedial or investigation activities at the site since 1992.

NEXT STEPS

A SASE will be completed for the site to determine if contaminants are present at concentrations that may pose a risk to receptors. If contaminants are found to pose such a risk, the site will undergo a remedial investigation and feasibility study to determine cleanup criteria and methodology. If contaminants are not found that could pose an increased risk to receptors, no further action will be warranted for the IR program, and the site will be released for future use by the activity.
